


Please put the images files into folders that are **not bigger than 100 MB** per folder.

For a smooth and easy upload to my server, I strongly suggest not to load the images one-by-one (which would work, though, but takes a lot of time for you), but to create ZIP archives instead. They can be up to 400 MB each, but I recommend sizes of around 100 MB - that makes the uploads more comfortable and easier to control for you.

If you never created a ZIP archive before and you are using Windows™, you can get 7-zip for free. Just google for one of those, to find the apps in your language. WINZip and WINRar are not bad, too, but they cost money.

7-Zip is a file archiver with a high compression ratio.

Once you installed it, you can right-click on any folder, click the little triangle right of “7-Zip” and choose “Add to <your folders name>”

...and 7-zip does exactly that.


Do not create “self-extracting archives”. They would be carrying “.exe” as suffix, and my web-interface, by good reason, would not accept an upload attempt.

Once your photos are taken, and are put into a neat package, you may want to send them to me. You can NOT use my eMail account for this (it's blocked for files exceeding a defined size) and you should not use any 3rd-party hosting providers, including, but not limited to Rapidshare and their kind, or any "cloud-based" "services" like Dropbox and their consorts. I will not download anything stored there, period.

On my server an upload functionality is installed, which enables you to upload directly into a discrete and pretty save environment. So use this, and we are all pretty warm and comfortable.

-1- Please type your real name here


-2- Here you should state, that this upload contains reference images for sculpting work (I use this interface for other activities, too.)

-3- A real eMail address of yours. Double-check, if my server tests the given address and can't find it, the uploaded files will be deleted.

-4- The BROWSE button lets you select one file from your computers file listing. If you want to upload two or three files, this has to be repeated.

-5- Here you can make statements like: "Hey, I need the bronze sculpture at Christmas, and today is Dec. 23rd, can you do that?"

-6- Begin Upload, you guessed it, begins the upload.
 Attention: the duration of the upload depends on your connection speed - so be patient!



The progress bar gives you an idea about how long the upload will take.
